COVENANT COMMITMENT DANIEL 9 (NIV)

¹In the first year of Darius son of Xerxes (a Mede by descent), who was made ruler over the Babylonian kingdom—²in the first year of his reign, I, Daniel, understood from the Scriptures, according to the word of the Lord given to Jeremiah the prophet, that the desolation of Jerusalem would last seventy years. ³So I turned to the Lord God and pleaded with him in prayer and petition, in fasting, and in sackcloth and ashes.

⁴I prayed to the Lord my God and confessed:

"Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps his covenant of love with those who love him and keep his commandments, ⁵we have sinned and done wrong. We have been wicked and have rebelled; we have turned away from your commands and laws. ⁶We have not listened to your servants the prophets, who spoke in your name to our kings, our princes and our ancestors, and to all the people of the land.

Daily Triumph JUNE 11-12 OAK HILLS CHURCH **RUMORS ABOUND GOD'S DANIEL IN** SECLUSION

Daniel, the king's officer, emerged today from his self-imposed seclusion. He spoke briefly with reporters at the palace briefing room.

"I went into seclusion to plead to God for our people and our country," he said at this afternoon's press conference.

When he appeared, Daniel was still garbed in sackcloth and ashes. He made no comments about his appearance. "I've been fasting and praying for the rescue of our nation. I was prompted to do so because of prophet Jeremiah's warning that the desolation of Jerusalem would last 70 years."

The king's representative shared some key points from his prayer:

God is a covenant God.

God is merciful and giving (despite our great sin).

Daniel explained the reasoning behind his decision to pray. He said that he petitioned God for

favor and forgiveness and restoration, "not because we are righteous but because God is.'

According to a palace source, Daniel was visited by the angel Gabriel, who gave further insight into the prophecy of Jerusalem's period of trial.

A follow up press briefing is scheduled for tomorrow, at which time Daniel promises to share Gabriel's revelation.

GOD'S COVENANT COMMITMENT

DANIEL 9 (NIV) CONT.

Jerusalem and all Israel, both near and far, in all the countries where you have scattered us because of our unfaithfulness to you. 8We and our kings, our princes and our ancestors are covered with shame, Lord, because we have sinned against you. 9The Lord our God is merciful and forgiving, even though we have rebelled against him; ¹⁰we have not obeyed the Lord our God or kept the laws he gave us through his servants the prophets. ¹¹All Israel has transgressed your law and turned away, refusing to obey you.

"Therefore the curses and sworn judgments written in the Law of Moses, the servant of God, have been poured out on us, because we have sinned against you. ¹²You have fulfilled the words spoken against us and against our rulers by bringing on us great disaster. Under the whole heaven nothing has ever been done like what has been done to Jerusalem. ¹³Just as it is written in the Law of Moses, all this disaster has come on us, yet we have not sought the favor of the Lord our God by turning from our sins and giving attention to your truth. ¹⁴The Lord did not hesitate to bring the disaster on us, for the Lord our God is righteous in everything he does; yet we have not obeyed him.

¹⁵ "Now, Lord our God, who brought your people out of Egypt with a mighty hand and who made for yourself a name that endures to this day, we have sinned, we have done wrong. ¹⁶Lord, in keeping with all your righteous acts, turn away your anger and your wrath from Jerusalem, your

city, your holy hill. Our sins and the iniquities of our ancestors have made Jerusalem and your people an object of scorn to all those around 115

¹⁷ "Now, our God, hear the prayers and petitions of your servant. For your sake, Lord, look with favor on your desolate sanctuary. ¹⁸Give ear, our God, and hear; open your eves and see the desolation of the city that bears your Name. We do not make requests of you because we are righteous, but because of your great mercy. ¹⁹Lord, listen! Lord, forgive! Lord, hear and act! For your sake, my God, do not delay, because your city and your people bear your Name."

THE SEVENTY "SEVENS"

²⁰While I was speaking and praying, confessing my sin and the sin of my people Israel and making my request to the Lord my God for his holy hill—²¹while I was still in prayer, Gabriel, the man I had seen in the earlier vision, came to me in swift flight about the time of the evening sacrifice. ²²He instructed me and said to me, "Daniel, I have now come to give you insight and understanding. ²³As soon as you began to pray, a word went out, which I have come to tell you, for you are highly esteemed. Therefore, consider the word and understand the vision:

²⁴ "Seventy 'sevens' are decreed for your people and your holy city to finish transgression, to put an end to sin, to atone for wickedness, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophecy and to anoint the Most Holy Place.

²⁵ "Know and understand this: From the time the word goes out to restore and rebuild

Jerusalem until the Anointed One, the ruler, comes, there will be seven 'sevens,' and sixty-two 'sevens.' It will be rebuilt with streets and a trench, but in times of trouble. ²⁶After the sixty-two 'sevens,' the Anointed One will be put to death and will have nothing. The people of the ruler who will come will destroy the city and the sanctuary. The end will come like a flood: War will continue until the end, and desolations have been decreed. ²⁷He will confirm a covenant with many for one 'seven.' In the middle of the 'seven' he will put an end to sacrifice and offering. And at the temple he will set up an abomination that causes desolation, until the end that is decreed is poured out on him."

PROJECT BRINGS JOY TO SENIORS

When Zachary Albrecht began planning for his Eagle Scout project, he knew just what he wanted to do: help senior citizens. It was something that had been on his heart for years.

"I guess I could trace it back to 8th grade," the high school iunior said. "We were supposed to invent a product that could help senior citizens."

The app his group built at the time simplified a computer

operating system to help seniors have an easier time using computers.

The idea of serving isn't anything new to Zachary. It's something he's been exposed to and doing since his family started attending Oak Hills Church about eight years ago. The 17-year-old also has gone on a mission trip, volunteered in Bibleland and plans to go to Guatemala this year with Oak Hills.

His recent project has been an extension of that desire to serve by helping seniors connect with their families. Zachary started developing a plan and recruiting volunteers to help at a local assisted living facility and the Senior

"We wanted to tailor it to what they wanted," Zachary said. "A lot of them weren't able to keep in frequent contact with their family."

Connect program was born.

He created a four-week curriculum that taught seniors how to use the internet, email and video chat.

"I wanted to merge one of my passions - technology - with helping senior citizens," he said. "It's always been something that's made me happy...

helping others. Seeing people benefit just puts a smile on your face."

One particular resident had an affinity for Thomas Kincade paintings and when she found the volume of paintings available with just a click, her life changed.

"She was extraordinarily excited," Zachary said. "She said it inspired her to start painting again. When I heard her say that, it just made me so happy that I was able to help her with that."

A few weeks later Zachary's group went to see how she was doing and gave her one last gift – painting supplies.

"It's things like that that make it all worth it," he said.
